Richard J. Glassock, M.D., MACP

Doctor Glassock is an internationally recognized expert in the field of Glomerular Diseases and Clinical Nephrology (Kidney Disease). He has published over 600 original papers, books, book chapters and reviews (100 in the past 5 years). He is the past-president of the American Society of Nephrology (1984), the National Kidney Foundation (USA) (1985) and past-Chairman of the American

Board of Internal Medicine (1991). He is a member of the American Association of Physicians, the American Clinical and Climatological Association and in 1999 was elected to Mastership in the American College of Physicians. He is the former Chair of the Departments of Medicine at the University of Kentucky (1992-1999) and Harbor-UCLA Medical Center (1980-1992). From 1967 to 1980 he was also the Chief of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. He was continuously funded for his Research by the National Institutes of Health from 1967 to 1992.

He has lectured in over 95 countries throughout the world, been a visiting professor at over 100 academic institutions and trained over 50 nephrologists, many of whom have gone on to distinguished academic careers. He is an honorary member of many International Nephrology Societies. He was the founding Editor-in-Chief of the NephSAP Journal of the American Society of Nephrology (2002), and continues as an Associate Editor of this Journal. He is Editor in Chief of the Nephrology section of UpToDate and an Associate Editor of the American Journal of Nephrology.

Doctor Glassock has received numerous awards and distinguished lectureships including the David Hume Memorial Award of the National Kidney Foundation, The Robert Narins Award of the American Society of Nephrology, and Distinguished Achievement Awards from both the UCLA School of Medicine and the Association of Professors of Medicine.. He is currently Professor Emeritus at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and an independent medical consultant.

He is married to Jo-Anne and lives in Laguna Niguel, California. He has four children (Ellen, Scott, Sharon and Mark), eight grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. His hobbies are golf, travel, fine wine, and history.
